Children's Sunday School- In this reading from the Gospel of John, Jesus teaches that he is "the real vine," in whose love we must remain if we are to grow and thrive. In today's homily, children hear today's story, then complete a poster reflecting their union a poster with Jesus, their "vine."

Adult Forum- Animate. Food: For Sara Miles, it's no small thing that one of Jesus' final acts before his death was to share a meal with his friends. After experiencing life alongside some of the nation's poorest and richest people in her work at a food pantry in San Francisco, Sara is more convinced than ever that food plays a crucial role in our spiritual well-being. But you might be surprised to find that she's less interested in what we eat than in whom we eat it with. As Sara explores the role of food in our spiritual formation, she challenges us to think beyond categories of good and bad, organic and processed, local and industrial to see food through a much different lens.
