**Children's Formation:**Sunday Morning, 10/14 at 9:30 am:

In the reading from the Gospel of Mark, Jesus compares the rich trying to enter God's kingdom to a camel trying to squeeze through the eye of a needle. In today's homily, children squeeze into church carrying a load of balloons, then hear today's story about a camel squeezing through a gate.

### 144th Convention of the Diocese of Southern Ohio

#### Nov. 3rd at Procter Center

This is the annual business meeting of the diocese and will be held on Nov. 3rd at Procter Center. Convention conducts elections, votes on the budget, resolutions, any other actions presented, hears reports, etc. It includes the clergy of the diocese and elected lay representatives from each of the congregations in the diocese, as well as ex-officio members of convention (who are entitled to seat and voice, but not vote) and many visitors (who may observe only). Approximately 500 people attend the convention. ***VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED!*** If you are interested in sharing your time and talents on Friday Nov. 2nd and/or Nov. 3rd, please let the church office know if you would like to help.
