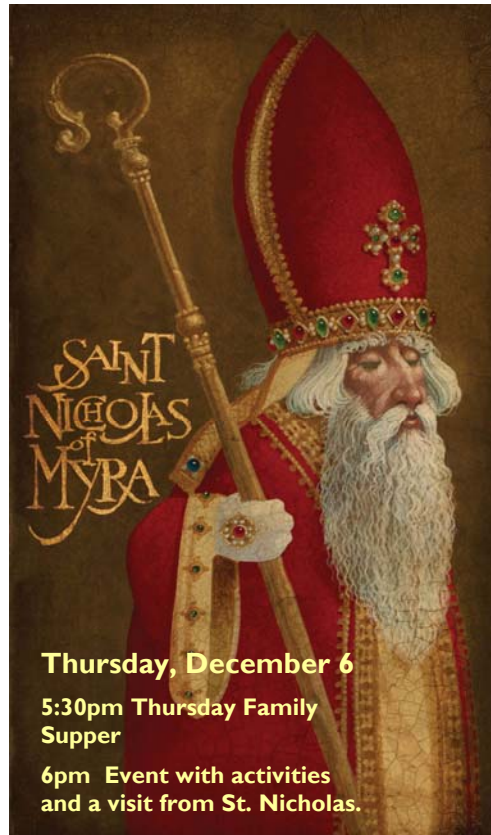
● Cancellations

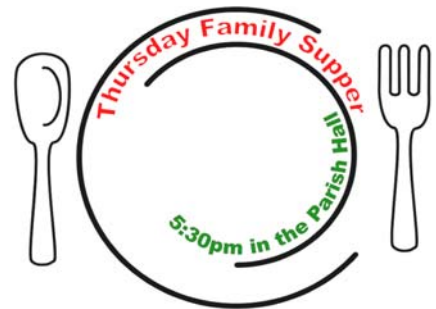

Children's Formation

Children's Chapel- Sunday Mornings during the 9:30am Service *Back in the Days* (PreK-K & 1st-5th Grade)

December 2- Advent is the first season of the Church year, because as Christians we begin with Jesus Christ. Advent means coming. During this season, we anticipate and prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ in our lives. In today's lesson, children learn about the meaning of the season, its symbols and traditions and the kinds of stories that are told and why they are important for us.

December 9- "As it is written in the book of Isaiah: 'Someone is shouting in the desert: Get the road ready for the Lord; make a straight path for him to travel'" (Luke 3:4) In this reading from the Gospel of Luke, John the Baptist brings his message of repentance, baptism, and preparation. In today's homily, children first hear this story, then silently consider how they would prepare for a visit from Jesus.

December 16- "In many different ways John preached the Good News to the people and urged them to change their ways." (Luke 3:18) In this reading from the Gospel of Luke, John the Baptist preaches justice and announces the coming of Jesus, the Messiah. In today's homily, children hear this story, then brainstorm and practice ways to follow God.

Adult Forum

December 2- Advent Workshop. Join the us in the Parish Hall as our community readies our hearts and our homes for the season of Advent.

December 9- Wired Word. We'll discuss a current event from the past week's news cycle in a biblical context including the Sunday lectionary. Big Questions will provide the framework for our time together as we confront the news with scripture encouraging in-depth exploration of the topic presented.

December 16- Animate: Community. Who doesn't want to be part of one of those? And yet the practice of community can often be one of the most painful experiences we have as people of faith. We try to find churches where we fit in only to feel left out. Or we get involved in small groups that fall apart in a jumble of dysfunction and hurt feelings. It's easier to keep our heads down and our hearts protected. But Doug Pagitt believes it's those hard experiences that make community a worthwhile practice. So how do we find our place in messy communities? How can we create communities that welcome others, no matter what kind of baggage they bring with them? The church is certainly an awkward family. And maybe that's just the kind we need.

This Month in Episcopal History

Amelia Jenks Bloomer December 30, 1894

Amelia Jenks was born in New York in 1818. As a young woman, she became an activist in the anti-slavery, temperance, and women's suffrage movements. However, it was another concern of Amelia's which made her a household name.

In her day, women's fashion in America encouraged tightly laced waists which caused severe health problems for many women. The fashion in the mid-19th century also called for skirts trailing the ground. This was a style arrangement which made it difficult to keep skirts reasonably clean at a time when livestock, such as horses, roamed areas where people walked.

Amelia married Josiah Bloomer and moved with him to Iowa. As one of her hobbies, she enjoyed designing women's clothes. One of her designs was a woman's costume featuring what are known as Turkish pants, or harem pants, loose baggy trousers gathered into tight bands at the ankles and waist. Over these, she wore a mid-calf length skirt.

To us today, Amelia's design seems a thoroughly modest garb, but since it was new in a very conservative time, it excited indignation and ridicule. Women's underpants and baggy outer pants, known as "bloomers" were worn for athletic activities such as swimming well into the 1940's.

Besides her forays in the fashion world, Amelia continued throughout her life as a social activist and helped people all around her. In recognition of her pioneering efforts, she has been placed as the person commemorated for December 30 on the Episcopal Calendar of Saints. Amelia Jenks Bloomer's commemoration by the Episcopal Church shows our interests to be far more wide ranging than merely theological issues. *~Jim Westman*

Don't worry about labels, we'll get them off and then put new ones for the patients. Thanks.
