Sunday Morning, 3/31 at 9:30am:
 In today's reading, Jesus illustrates the depth of God's love with the parable of the lost son. In today's homily, children hear the story, then learn that they too, like the lost son, are special children beloved by God.

Thursday Evening, 4/4 at 6:00pm: In the lesson today, the children will learn the story of Lydia's interactions with Paul at Philippi's city gate. Then, the children will discuss ways they have seen God at work in their lives, perhaps through people they have met or friends they have.
