Getting criminals to join a community is the first big step in changing how they view society and making the changes that will keep them from behaviors that tend to cause a return to prison after their release. Receiving cookies from outside strangers is an outward and visible sign that Christian community exists, even for them, and they can join. Bill, Stu, and I will pass out bags for 1 dozen cookies each after the services. Chocolate chip are the types we need most but all kinds of cookies are appreciated. The official collection date is April 14, but I always check the Narthex at Choir Rehearsal on Thursday evening, and I will probably be at all services for Holy Week. *Dick Gehman*
