Baptism Class, March 22, 2020 at 1:00pm. This class is designed for parents seeking baptism of small children. Holy Baptism is appropriately administered within the Eucharist as the chief service on a Sunday or other feast day. Holy Baptism is especially appropriate at the Easter Vigil, on the Day of Pentecost, on All Saints' Day or the Sunday after All Saints' Day, and on the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord (the First Sunday after the Epiphany). It is recommended that, as far as possible, Baptisms be reserved for these occasions or when a bishop is present. (BCP, 298-312)

2020 Baptismal Dates: April 11, 12 or 26, May 31, November 1.

A Children's Communion Class, March 22, 2020 at 3:30pm. This class is offered in the spring and fall of each year as a family learning event in which children are able to tour the sacristy, learn about the elements, discover more fully how and why we celebrate eucharist, and participate in making communion bread for parish use.
