From the Rector's Desk

On June 1st in our calendar of Saints we will celebrate Justin the Martyr; who was executed by the Roman Empire in 165 AD. He was a very important second-century Christian apologist and philosopher. In fact, he is one of the most important early Christian writers.

Justin helped articulate the theology that the Logos, or Word of God, was present in all of creation. He believed that the Logos was revealed in the Old Testament prophets and in the person of Jesus Christ. Justin also believed that the Logos was present in the soul of every person.

This last belief of Justin's is extremely important for St. Patrick's as we move into the summer. Because the divine Logos is in each and everyone one of us, it means we are all on the same team. A colleague of mine recently described Christian life in a congregation as more like rowing crew instead of competitive diving. Parish life might feel like a solo endeavor, that we are standing on a platform preparing to do our own thing. However, we are all on the same crew and like rowing crew, we each have an oar. When we all pull in the same direction in rhythm with each other, then we can go far and fast.

This summer we will be taking significant steps in our strategic plan. Development work on our third service offering has already begun, as has our search for a part time Minister of Communications. We will also have some outdoor services this summer to test interest and locations for an outdoor worship space. Your participation and support of these efforts are key.

The best way to grab an oar and pull in rhythm is through prayer. Pray daily for the growth of St. Patrick's. Your prayers need not be long, verbose, or burdened by flowery rhetoric. No, it could be as simple as every time you start your car, offer this prayer silently, "Creating God, please help St. Patrick's to grow." Additionally, every time your enter the worship space, pick a pew on the opposite side of the room and pray for God to fill it and to bless the folks that sit in it through this faith community.

I am extremely excited for the summer. It's going to be a time of recreation and recreation, of inventiveness and exploration, a time when the divine logos in each of us gets to proclaim God's love and serve one another.

Wellness Words

Recently, Lissa and Roy attended a S.A.I.L. presentation at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. You may remember that this is an ecumenical group co-founded by the Rev. Dr. Stephen Smith with the intent to focus on topics that all religions have in common. It was a great presentation by some Dublin leaders who talked about the programs available in the city and the school system to improve mental health. We have impressive programs in this city in both the prevention of mental health problems and the treating of them when they occur. This presentation came serendipitously at the time the Surgeon General (SG) of the United States, ADM Vivek Murthy, published a directive that identified Loneliness as an epidemic in the U.S. This is another unexpected consequence of the COVID pandemic. The two issues, deteriorating mental health and loneliness, are inextricably combined.

In a recent Johns Hopkins research report (March 2023), the conclusions were important for all of us to consider. One in 4 older adults, in community living, experiences social isolation and an increased risk of dementia. There was no difference in racial or ethnic groups. The researchers identified behaviors such as withdrawing from human social contact, an increase in anger, irritability, and sudden lashing out, both verbally and physically. This really emphasizes the importance of Stephen Ministers and Lay Eucharistic Visitors as ministries in our church family.

The Surgeon General noted that loneliness includes risks that are as deadly as smoking and costs BILLIONS of dollars in poor health care outcomes. For example, there is a 29% increase in the risk of heart disease, a 32% increase in the risk of stroke, a 50% increase in the risk of dementia, and greater than a 60% increase in premature death. In the case of our children and families, the SG has noted that our overuse and dependence on our phones and social media have significantly increased social isolation, threats to self-esteem, decrease in emotionally present parenting, and teen depression and suicide. He strongly recommends a "Culture of Consciousness" and "Reforming digital platforms".

So, what do we do? First, we recognize the problem exists even here. Second, we take an honest look at how we use our phones and social media. Think, how would I feel if I didn't have my phone for 48 hours? 24 hours? If that sends shivers down your spine, then you are probably dependent on your phone and/or social media. Third, it's a matter of recognizing the signs. Does your family talk with one another? Eat together as a family? When was the last time there was spontaneous joyful activity in your house? When was the last time you told yourself that you were good and at peace? Looked forward to being with other people for fun? If these questions, and their honest answers, help you think about recognizing loneliness and its effects on everyone's lives, then you've made a good

start.

Writing A Love Letter to Yourself

One of our essential practices in spiritual growth is to learn to not only accept, but also to love ourselves. This practice, at first, may look like bragging, but counterintuitively, it is what is necessary to feel compassion and love

for others. We are made by the Divine Source, we are made of stardust, we want to feel worthy of God's love. This is an exercise toward that goal, let's write a love letter to ourselves!

Sit in a comfortable space, possibly outside or in a place of peace. Imagine you are being reunited with a long-lost friend, there has been some distance between you and some wounding, but a person you have trusted implicitly. Let's make amends and new commitments to each other! Don't overthink the process, just let your heart lead you.

For example, "Dear Body,

You are so beautifully and wonderfully made, and we have been together for almost 78 years now, and it has sometimes felt difficult for me to care for you. I have pushed you relentlessly when you wanted to rest and I am so sorry for the hard times when I have not listened to you and when I take you for granted...I promise to...etc".

Were there any surprises for you in writing this letter?

Fr. Jason presented his report on his attendance at the educational conferences in May. He gave the vestry a brief summary as to the topics and focus of these two conferences as well as his experiences.

Fr. Jason also presented the vestry with an updated total of garage sale receipts.

The Senior Warden's report was submitted and read by the vestry and was accepted.

The Junior Warden's report was presented, and updates were given on the north parking lot drain repair project and the parking lot resurfacing/sealing project.


The Treasurer's report, as well as the minutes of the previous meeting, were approved by the Vestry.


