From the Rector's Desk

It's the most wonderful time of the year!

Have you ever wondered why Christmas Pageants are never based on the Gospel of Mark?

As we dive head first into the season of Advent with its prophetic denunciations, stories of camel skin clad preachers with odd diets, and Jesus making predictions about the end of the world, the Church tasks us with preparing for the coming of the Christ Child. The simplest and best way to prepare for the coming of the Christ child is read the gospels so closely focused on his life.

Advent is also a new church year. Our Sunday readings focus on a particular Gospel that rotates on a three year cycle (Years A, B, & C). We are finishing up year A which focuses on Matthew and on Advent 1 (Dec. 3rd) we will start year B which focuses on Mark.

The Gospel of Mark is the shortest of the four gospels in the New Testament, but it is also one of the most important. It is the first gospel to be written, and it is the one that most closely follows the events of Jesus' life.

So, join us this advent for our annual Gospel Read-Along. Start December 1st and read one chapter a day. You'll finish up on December 16th. Also there will be reflection videos posted each day on YouTube. New this year, the audio from each video will also be released as a podcast. So, get your bibles ready and join us in reading along together the Gospel of Mark.


Wonderful Wigglers Kids Christmas Eve Handbells!

The November Vestry meeting was called to order on November 15th at 7:01 pm by Fr. Jason. All vestry members were present either in person or on zoom. Dick Gehman opened the meeting with a prayer.

Fr. Jason presented his written report highlighting the pledge dinners, the Way of Love dinner series, the viewing of the Philadelphia 11 film as well as the attendance of St Patrick's folks at different interfaith activities during the last month. He also shared with the vestry the advent preparations and devotional aids that are available to the congregation. In his report was a copy of the Mutual Ministry Review that was done in August. A short discussion was had about attendance at the different service times.

Ed Yuhas submitted the Senior Wardens report. He conveyed to the vestry the progress of the nominating committee and the formation of a full slate of nominees for both vestry and convention delegates.

Roy Barker brought the vestry up to date on all the different projects that were accomplished during the last month around the church. Appreciation was expressed to all the people who took part in the various completed projects and those involved in planning upcoming projects.

Vicky Bratton presented an update on the pledge drive. So far 125 pledges have been received. Outstanding pledges and trends were discussed. Plans for reaching out to parishioners yet to turn in a pledge were dis-

cussed.

Bill Righter and Fr. Jason presented a second look at the proposed budget. Many line items were looked at and explanations of changes were given. The next step in the budget process is the awaiting of the final total of pledge amounts in December.

The Treasurer's report was presented by Bill Righter showing that the revenues for October were under budget by \$3,400 and the year-to-date revenues were \$69,000 under budget. Operating pledges were under budget by \$3,500 for the month and year to date \$72,400 under budget. Expenses for October were on budget. Year to date expenses remain \$23,000 under budget.

Both the Treasurer's report and the minutes of the last meeting were approved by the vestry. With a closing prayer the meeting was adjourned at 8:10 pm.
