Theology in a Nutshell: Big Ideas in Bite-Sized Bits Our next *St. Pat's Faith Talk* podcast series offers up bite-sized introductions to the basics of systematic theology. The word theology means words about God or God-talk. What we say about God, in both word and deed, is a testimony about the nature of and our relationship with God. Using the Nicene Creed and the Outline of the Faith from the Book of Common Prayer, Fr. Jason offers a brief introduction into thinking and speaking of God in a systematic way. *St. Pat's Faith Talk* is available where ever you get your podcasts. The Sunday Sermon is published on Mondays and the Teaching Episodes come out on Thursdays.
